Withern Village Hall

We have received a handful of responses to our notice in the last Newsletter regarding a potential new Village Hall, and would like to add the following information to clarify any queries:

The GDF at Theddlethorpe isn't guaranteed to go ahead, but Nuclear Waste Services have offered money to local community groups in the event that it does.

They currently have a pot of £1,000,000 on offer until June, with a further £1,000,000 for the next year - which is likely to carry on with similar amounts, over similar time frames. In the event of test drilling then this sum will increase to £2,500,000.

The money that is currently on offer is regardless of whether or not the GDF goes ahead at Theddlethorpe.

We are desperately in need of a new hall - or at the very least, a huge scheme of refurbishment. Although in the last decade we have undertaken schemes of work, including: new outside storage space, a new and improved kitchen, a licensed bar, a new disabled toilet and fully refurbished existing toilets; the work that needs undertaking now is on a grander scale. The hall is essentially a fifty year old shed on a concrete base, originally erected as a scout hut. The current building needs insulation, a new roof, some windows replaced and is also suffering from subsidence (the extent of which hasn't yet been diagnosed). Feedback has also confirmed that we would benefit from a larger usable space, and a more aesthetically pleasing one. This would also be our opportunity to create a more eco-friendly hall.

It's early stages with the application, we have so far expressed interest and contacted an architect to draw up outline plans (which can be used in the future, if this doesn't go ahead). The next stage is the application, which - amongst other things - we need letters of support from residents and hall users. This support would be our evidence that there is a need for a new hall, which can be used for future generations.

The support is not for the siting of the GDF.

The village hall committee consists of volunteers who work hard putting on events, and trying to bring the community together. We aren't linked to the government or politics, and all have our own views and opinions.

In the past we have lost out in similar circumstances: nobody took action when the wind turbines were situated near Gayton, and we missed out on funding which we could have had.

The narrative is that "we the people" will decide whether the GDF is sited at Theddlethorpe. Whether this is true or not, or whether we will get to vote on an individual basis remains to be seen - but pplying for this funding is not us jumping on board with NWS. The representatives have said that applying for the funding is not us "voting yes". If it goes ahead anyway and money is on offer, we believe we may as well take what is being offered. There are currently no other grants or funding available which would enable us to undertake this level of work.

If anybody would like to discuss this further, the next Village Hall meeting and AGM are on Tuesday, 9th May at 7:00pm.


