

The Red Lion Development

The meeting was very well attended, thank you to everybody who came. A big thank you to Tim and Jean for travelling to share the plans, and answer our questions.

In case you missed it, the key points to take away are:

- The plan is to convert the main part of the existing Red Lion building into several dwellings, and build an additional two or three dwellings on the adjacent land.
- These are outline plans only, none have yet been submitted to ELDC.
- The building is in a state of disrepair, and is not viable to operate as a pub again.
- As it is a small development, there is no requirement for affordable or social housing.
- A proposed community building will be built against the boundary with the school. The use for this is yet to be determined. The recent survey results were greatly in favour of a shop, but this would be community run and we are assessing the viability.
- Many people also requested a Post Office service. Unfortunately the decision to discontinue this service lies with the Post Office. There is still facility at the Chapel to host them, we don't need a new build.
