

13th September: 2.30pm-3.15pm 11th October: 2.30pm to 3.15pm




# Bending light

Investigate how you can bend light with water!

You need: bowl, drinking glass, coin, ruler and blue tack

# Method

- 1. Fill a glass with water and lower a ruler into it. Look at the ruler through the side of the glass. What happens? When you look at something, what you really see is light bouncing off it. Length bends as it moves from water to air. So, when you look at the ruler in the glass it appears to bend
- 2. Use blue tack to stick a coin to the bottom of a bowl. Step back from the bowl until you can't see the coin. Fill the bowl with water until you see the coin The science! reappear.



The coin doesn't move but because of the light bending when travelling from water and ait the coin seems to re-appear.




