Second World War

Corporal Fred Searby Rifleman Charles Edmund Westerby, age 19



Richard "Dick" Branston

Lance Sergeant 434, 10th Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Killed in action 26 February 1916 age 35. Buried in Grave IV.B.36 at Brewery Orchard Cemetery, Bois-Grenier, Nord, France. Richard Branston born 1880 Parson Drove, Cambridgeshire, son of Richard (a corn miller) and Lucy (nee Marshall, born Authorpe) Branston. His father died in 1889 and at the time of the 1891 Census he was living with his uncle John J Marshall, a farmer and innkeeper, at the Red Lion in Withern.

William Brumpton

Lance Corporal 15838, 1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Spilsby. Killed in action 3 July 1916 age 20. Buried in Grave IV.P.3 at Gordon Dump Cemetery, Ovillers-La Boisselle, Somme, France. Born Kelstern 1896, son of Charles (a farm worker) and Frances Mary (nee Walker) Brumpton, subsequently of Flax Mill Cottages, Aby.

George Cross

Private 40360, 2nd/6th Battalion, North Staffordshire Regiment. Enlisted Horncastle. Killed in action 21 March 1918 age 20. Commemorated on Bay 7 and 8 of the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France. Born Woodthorpe 1898, son of George (horseman on a farm) and Sarah (nee Chapman) Cross, subsequently of Tothill.

Arthur Enderby

Private 237119, 54th Battalion, Canadian Infantry, Enlisted Toronto 15 March 1916. Died 14 November 1917. Commemorated on Panels 18-24-26-30 of the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Belgium. Born Winthorpe, son of Arthur (a farmer) and Betsy Ann (nee Dawson) Enderby, of The Manor House, Withern. In 1906 he married Beatrice May Clarke in Lincolnshire. At the time of his death she was living at of 308 Rhodes Avenue, Toronto. He served with the Lincolnshire Regiment for 7 years including the South African Campaign (Boer War)

Charles Lane

Private 37227, 11th Battalion, East Yorkshire Regiment. Formerly 2016 Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Louth. Killed in action 8 September 1918. Buried in Grave II.R.23 at Trois Arbres Cemetery, France. Born Grantham

Herbert Lane

Private 17897, 8th Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Louth, born and resident Alford. Killed in action 4 October 1917. Buried in Grave XXI.B.10 at Hooge Crater Cemetery, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium.

Arthur Massey

Private 1887, 11th Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Louth 1 March 1916, resident Stain Hill, Withern. Died of pneumonia at Newcastle Hospital 16 June 1916 age 27. Buried in St. Margaret's Churchyard, Withern. Robert Arthur Massey born Skendleby 1889, son of Charles Henry (a farmer) and Annie (nee Gunby) Massey, subsequently of Stain Hill.

Fred Searby

Lance Corporal 12894, A Company, 1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Alford. Died of wounds 3 July 1916 age 25. Buried in Grave A.6 at Fricourt British Cemetery, Somme, France. Born 1891 Alford, son of Fred (a blacksmith) and Elizabeth (nee Gilliatt) Searby, subsequently of Withern.

Joseph William Searby

Sapper 37549, 202nd Field Company, Royal Engineers. Enlisted Lincoln, resident Spalding. Killed in action 11 October 1916 age 28. Buried in Grave IX.B.14 Caterpillar Valley Cemetery, France. William married Violet May Garwell (born 1887, Gosberton) in 1912. At the time of his death she was living at 47, Havelock Street, Spalding. Brother of Fred Searby.

William Ward

Private 250550, 20th Battalion, Durham Light Infantry. Enlisted Louth. Killed in action 5 October 1918. Military Medal. Buried in Grave VI.E.3 at Zantvoorde British Cemetery, Belgium. Born 1883 Gainsborough, son of William (an engineer on a steam boat) and Charlotte (nee Gravil) Ward.

Ronald Webster

Driver 45315, 128th Field Company, Royal Engineers. Enlisted Nottingham, resident West Bridgford, Notts. Died of wounds 15 June 1917 age 27. Buried in Grave VII.B.6/18 at Railway Dugouts Burial Ground, Ieper, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Born Withern 1890, son of Henry (a butcher) and Eliza Jane (nee Jarvis) Webster of Withern. Personal Inscription: HEARTS THAT CHANGE NOT LOVE THAT NEVER DIES AND PEACE BE YOURS

Maurice White

Private 17898 1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Enlisted Louth. Died of wounds 9 September 1918 age 30. Buried in Grave IV.E.4 at Abbeville Communal Cemetery Extension, Somme, France. Born 1888 Strubby, son of John William (a farm worker) and Susan Jane (nee Horton) White subsequently of Withern. Brother of Willie White.

Willie White

Private 72477, 2nd Battalion, West Yorkshire Regiment (Prince of Wales's Own), formerly 18/40785 Sherwood Foresters. Enlisted Louth. Killed in action 4 October 1918. Buried in Grave II.D.15 at St. Nicolas British Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France. Brother of Maurice White.

William Stones

Cannot be identified in relation to Withern, but in the 1901 Census there is a William E Stones, age 25, born Mumby, married with 2 children, occupation grocer's carter.

Second World War

Fred Searby

Corporal 4979943, 6th Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. Died 5 January 1944 age 26. Buried in Grave XVIII. B. 6 at Cassino War Cemetery, Italy. Born 1917 Withern, son of Albert Edward (blacksmith and farmer) and Grace (nee Mountain) Searby of Willows, Withern. Two of Albert's brothers were killed in WW1 (see above).

Charles Edmund Westerby

Rifleman 14683545, 9th Battalion, Cameronians (Scottish Rifles). Killed in the Brussels area 7 September 1944 age 19. Buried in grave VII. D. 8 at Leopoldsburg War Cemetery, Limburg, Belgium. Son, known as Charlie, of Ernest and Eva Westerby of Withern.



For the Fallen

Poem by Robert Laurence Binyon (1869-1943), published in The Times newspaper on 21 September 1914.

With proud thanksgiving, a mother for her children, England mourns for her dead across the sea. Flesh of her flesh they were, spirit of her spirit, Fallen in the cause of the free.

Solemn the drums thrill: Death august and royal Sings sorrow up into immortal spheres.
There is music in the midst of desolation And a glory that shines upon our tears.

They went with songs to the battle, they were young, Straight of limb, true of eye, steady and aglow. They were staunch to the end against odds uncounted, They fell with their faces to the foe.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

They mingle not with their laughing comrades again; They sit no more at familiar tables of home; They have no lot in our labour of the day-time; They sleep beyond England's foam.

But where our desires are and our hopes profound, Felt as a well-spring that is hidden from sight, To the innermost heart of their own land they are known As the stars are known to the Night;

As the stars that shall be bright when we are dust, Moving in marches upon the heavenly plain, As the stars that are starry in the time of our darkness, To the end, to the end, they remain.

It's a gentle years class emphasizing mindful movement and breathing rather than strong postures. Chair poses are offered throughout the class and mats are encouraged if you have a stronger yoga practice but it'll not be a calorie burner. The aim is to increase bone and muscle strength, core stabilization, posture, flexibility, balance improvement, and reduce stress and anxiety.


Please send me an email if you need anymore details.
